## **New cases of COVID-19 reported**

KEARNEY – Ten (10) new cases of COVID-19 were reported by Two Rivers Public Health Department in the seven-county region it serves over the holiday weekend. Please check the Two Rivers website for up to date information for our citizens on current COVID-19 facts.

New confirmed cases include:

- Dawson County – 1
- Buffalo County – 7
- Kearney County – 1
- Phelps County - 1

As of July 6, 2020, Two Rivers will no longer be sending out daily press releases. There will be one sent out every week updating the results of cases from the previous week unless there are more than 5 cases reported per day. This is the result of a diminishing number of cases being reported on a daily basis.

COVID-19 is still circulating in our district. Two Rivers recommends continued actions to prevent the spread of any illness such as:

- Knowing how it spreads
- Washing your hands often
- Avoid close contact
- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others
- Cover your cough and sneeze
- Clean and disinfect
- Monitor your health

Recent studies show that a significant portion of people with COVID-19 lack symptoms and those who eventually develop symptoms can pass the virus to others before showing symptoms, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The CDC now recommends wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (grocery stores, pharmacies, etc.) especially in areas of significant community-based transmission - <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/prevent-getting-sick/cloth-face-cover-faq.html>.

Cloth face coverings are not a substitute for social distancing. Public health officials continue to emphasize that maintaining 6-foot social distancing is crucial to slowing the spread of the virus.

Testing is available to the public at the discretion of health care providers. Individuals are more likely to be tested by if they are essential infrastructure staff, in direct contact with a laboratory confirmed case, a health care worker, first responder or age 65 or older.
